The ICJ Rules

Rule 5-102: Absconder Under ICJ Supervision



A juvenile probationer or parolee who hides, conceals, or absents him/herself so that he/she is unavailable for the legal process or authorized control.

Reasons to suspect a juvenile has absconded:

- Reported missing by the parent, legal guardian, or placement resource
- Missed scheduled appointments and unavailable for supervision
- Reported as truant
 (Which may be a violation of their supervision conditions)
