2021 ICJ State Council Report

ICJ Rule 2-107 requires that "Every member state and territory shall establish and maintain a State Council..." and "shall meet at least once annually..." State Council reports are due on January 31 each year.



STATE HIGHLIGHTS

State Council Formation

New Mexico formed a State Council and held first meeting in over 6 years

- 50 states have formed State Councils, as compared to 49 in 2020 and 46 in 2019.
 - 3 have not met within the last 7 years.
- 2 states reported having no State Council.
- 22 states/territories reported at least one required membership vacancy.
- The most common barrier was securing appointments.

State Council Meetings

Illinois held first meeting in over 6 years

- 41 State Councils met in 2021, as compared to 35 in 2020 and 40 in 2019.
- 3 State Councils have not met in the past 7 years or longer.
- Only 1 state/territory cited COVID-19 as the reason for not meeting.
