



2024 State Council Report

Highlights

State councils met 49 times in 2024, compared to 70 meetings reported in 2023.

The number of states holding the required annual meeting dropped from 42 in 2023 to 40 in 2024. 77 percent of states are in compliance with ICJ Rule 2-107.

27 states have at least one statutorily required member vacancy, with the legislative branch representative being the most reported vacancy.

48 out of 52 member states submitted the required state council report. No reports from: NH, RI, USVI, & WA

The Interstate Compact for Juveniles, Article IX and ICJ Rule 2-107 require states to create a state council for interstate juvenile supervision and meet at least once annually. State councils develop policies that support implementation of the Compact across agencies, including courts, detention centers, & law enforcement.

5 states reported no state council formed, an increase from 2 states reporting no state council formed in 2023.
