Unfinished Business

Rule Amendment Proposals

- Rule 1-101
 - O Representative T. Casanova (VT) reviewed the rule amendment proposal to add a definition of Human Trafficking to Rule 1-101. The proposed definition was: "Human Trafficking: exploitation of a person through the use of force, fraud, or coercion for the purposes of forced labor or commercial sex. For sex trafficking, the elements of force, fraud, or coercion are not needed since minors cannot consent to commercial sex acts."
 - Representative T. Casanova (VT) suggested replacing the word "minors" with the phrase "anyone under the age of 18".
 - o E. Monique-James (VI) recommended a grammatical editin the "Justification" section.
 - O N. Napier (CT) recommended adding that the definition of Human Trafficking mirrors the federal definition to the "Justification" section of the proposal. The following sentence was added to the "Justification" section: "This proposal is based on the federal definition of human trafficking."
 - o Director Underwood suggested an edit for grammatical purposes.
 - O Representative T. Casanova (VT) reviewed the proposed definition, as amended: "Human Trafficking: exploitation of a person through the use of force, fraud, or coercion for the purposes of forced labor or commercial sex. For sex trafficking of a person under 18, the elements of force, fraud, or coercion are not needed since anyone under the age of 18 cannot consent to commercial sex acts."
 - E. Monique-James (VI) made a motion to refer the Human Trafficking definition rule amendment to the Rules Committee. E. Lee, Jr. (NJ) seconded. The motion passed.
